A gathering of Oregon nursing workforce leaders to offer timely updates and share insights from peers and stakeholders.

Nursing Workforce

Nurse Attrition: A discussion of national data from NCSBN and National Forum of State Nursing Workforce Centers revealed that retirement is the most frequently cited reason for nurses leaving the profession within a 5-year span. However, 'stress' and 'workload' followed closely behind, prompting strong reactions from Huddlers about the urgent need to address workplace strain. Huddlers noted that long-term projections (e.g. "where will you be in 5 years?") are often disrupted by macro-events (e.g. 2008 crash, COVID-19).

HB 2789: This Oregon law now permits Registered Nurses to bill Medicaid under specific circumstances- effective January 2026- is an incremental but historic shift. RNs can bill for care management services under a specific set of circumstances; RNs have to be licensed in Oregon, the services rendered must be with the RN scope, and the patients cannot have a current primary care provider. HB 2789 also lays out some limitations, for example, RNs cannot diagnose or prescribe, and there will be no scope-of-practice expansion. OHA will lead rule development, and OSBN will serve as an informational resource. A RAC will develop documentation standards and service lists. There is a FAQ and a one-pager in development to clarify the bill and reduce misinformation. More information to follow.

Nursing Education

Faculty Onboarding and Mentorship Needs: A community college requested help establishing a budget-conscious new faculty orientation. The group emphasized the need for mentoring and workload release, clear logistics support, and foundational teaching methodology training. There are concerns about the chronic under-funding of faculty support. Huddlers recommend leveraging OCNE resources when possible, connecting with programs for templates and best practices, and possibly a peer mentoring network.
