Nurse Workforce

Nurse Well-Being Impacts: Policy changes and political news have weighed heavily on nurses' mental health, with many huddlers expressing frustration, confusion, and worry about the broader climate; concerns included immigration status, perceptions of state leadership, and government shutdown. Some noted that today's environment feels similar to the start of the COVID-19 pandemic, prompting calls for nurse-led interventions and community supports.

Tribal Summit Reflections: OSBN Director Rachel Prusak reported from the government-to[1]government Tribal Summit with Oregon's nine federally recognized tribes, noting history, consultation responsibilities, and concern about cultural erasure, while highlighting tribal liaison roles across agencies
